Drop Zone- Hole No 3

Thanks Players Committee for this new Local Rule.



When playing the 3rd hole, and the ball is virtually certain to have entered the red staked penalty area in front of the red, white, and blue tee boxes, the player has two options:

- a) The player may drop in the prepared drop zone adjacent to the front yellow teeing area, adding a penalty stroke or
- b) The player may return to the teeing area and play another ball under the stroke & distance option adding a penalty stroke. Rule 17.1 & 14.3b ref.
